COMPETITON ADJUDICATORS

HENG-HAN HOU

Hailing from Taiwan, Heng-Han Hou is a highly sought-after violinist, celebrated for his intuitive musicality and captivating performances. A versatile artist, he excels as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral player, earning recognition for his expressive artistry. A notable crowning moment in his career came with the honour of performing in the Coronation Orchestra for King Charles III and Queen Camilla—a rare opportunity bestowed upon only two individuals from outside the UK.

Recent solo highlights include a concerto performance with the Kindred Spirits Orchestra in Toronto. He also participated in the Intercultural String Exchange project. For this initiative, Heng-Han and his colleagues presented seven concerts involving Arabic and Afro-Cuban music, as well as Metis fiddling.

Committed to music education, he has held several teaching assistantships at the University of Toronto. His dedication to teaching has also led him to serve as a coach for the Toronto Summer Music Community Program, the Lake George Music Festival in the United States, and the Regina Summer String.

Heng-Han received his Doctor of Musical Arts in Violin Performance from the University of Toronto in 2022 under the tutelage of Prof. Jonathan Crow. In 2023-2024, he joined the faculty at Brandon University for a one-year appointment and recently became a faculty member at the University of Saskatchewan, where he teaches the String Literature course. Since September 2020, Heng-Han has held the tenured Principal Second Violin position with the Regina Symphony Orchestra.

JENNIFER TENFORD

Jennifer Tenford is a sessional lecturer in the Faculty of Media, Art and Performance at the University of Regina. She holds undergraduate degrees from the University of Regina and the University of British Columbia, as well as a Master of Music degree in woodwind performance and conducting from the University of North Texas. Proficient on multiple woodwinds, Jennifer performs frequently with the Regina Symphony Orchestra, Reed Aloud saxophone quartet, University of Regina wind ensemble and clarinet ensemble, Regina Winds, and in the pit orchestra for many musical theatre productions. She recently retired from a rewarding career teaching public school bands and continues to enjoy teaching through private lessons, clinics, festivals and band camps.

ROBERT URSAN

Robert Ursan holds degrees in music from Oberlin College, the University of Toronto and the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama in Glasgow, Scotland. He has written three operas, seven musicals, incidental music for twelve Globe Theatre productions, over one hundred arts songs as well as works for piano, viola, flute and string quartet. He has directed, musical directed, written - singly or in multiple combination - over 150 productions in the last 30 years (the record is nine shows in the 1999-2000 season). He is currently Artistic Director of Do It With Class — Young People's Theatre, with which he has worked for the last three decades.
